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Reading in KS1

Dear Parent/Carer,

I just wanted to send out an information letter with regards to reading across KS1, just to clarify the system to everyone.

If your child is on the RWI scheme:

- Book bags will go home daily and come back to school daily.
- Children must read their RWI book at home, with an adult daily to help with progress.
- Adult to sign the yellow reading record book, when reading has taken place, to show support of reading at home. Staff will stamp the books daily as a reward for the children.
- Library books for RWI children are chosen on Monday, and they do not need recording in yellow Reading Record Books. These are for reading for pleasure, independently or with a grown up.
- Library books to be returned on Monday morning please (1 week loan).
- Assessments take place every half term when on the RWI scheme, where progress is closely monitored.

If your child is not on the RWI scheme they are a Fluency Reader.

- Children will choose a short novel from our library (or can be a book from home) on Monday.
- Short novels to go home daily and come back to school daily.
- Adults to read short novels with children, daily if possible, focusing on reading with fluency, accuracy and speed. Children need to read with expression and good voice choice.
- Adults to sign the yellow reading record book, when short novel reading has taken place, to show support of reading at home. Staff will stamp the books daily as a reward for the children.
- Children will read a picture book in class, when it is reading for pleasure.
- Short novels to be returned every Monday, where a new one will be chosen.
- Encourage a love of reading at home, exposing them to lots of reading material.

Many thanks for your support at home with reading, all of which makes a huge difference when it comes to reading progress. Thank you!
