Rule and Guidance	The /f/, /l/, /s/, /z/ and /k/ sounds are usually spelt as ff, ll, ss, zz and ck if they come straight after a single vowel letter in short words . Exceptions: if, pal, us, bus, yes.						nk is usually at the end of a word.
