"OUR RULES"

Our Governors check to make sure that our school, and everything that happens in it, will keep children safe.



Fences, locks, security cameras and lanyards to keep you safe and happy.



We'll make sure you know where to get help; at home or at school, if you're worried or upset.

RISKS

What are the risks I might be worried about?

No worry is too big or too small!
We are here to listen and help with all worries.



BULLYING

You might be purposely hurt by punching or kicking, nasty words or being left out, over and over again. It could be anyone who does this to you.

NEGLECT

You might not have everything you need to feel happy, healthy and safe. Not enough food, clean clothes or a bed to sleep in.



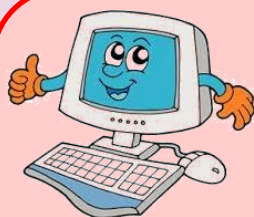

ABUSE

Bullying and neglect are part of abuse. It can also involve you hearing or seeing things that upset you or being made to do things that make you uncomfortable. It could sometimes involve private parts of your body.

E-SAFETY

Bullying and abuse can happen online too. Report anything bad that happens and keep your passwords and personal info private. Make sure you don't trust strangers.

STRANGERS

People out of school and online that you don't know are strangers. You shouldn't do what strangers tell you to do and you should tell a trusted adult if a stranger has approached you in person or online.

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What should I do if I am worried or upset?

The golden rule is...

TALK TO US!!



DON'T KEEP IT A SECRET!

If someone is hurting you, being unkind, upsetting you or making you do things you don't feel right about, then...

TELL A TRUSTED ADULT!



Talk to a teacher or adult you trust.



You can call Childline (a service that will listen to you and help).



Write a worry down and put it in a Worry Box

We are here to listen and do something to help.



What actually happens when I tell someone?



- All the grown-ups at school will listen to you kindly.
- They will be proud of you for coming to talk.
- They cannot promise to keep what you say a secret.
- Grown-ups at school will talk to the Safeguarding Team, which is Mr Wood, Mr Hesketh, Mrs Dickson, Mrs Dawson and Miss Quayle (our safeguarding governor)
- The Safeguarding Team will decide what needs to be done to help you.
- They may need to talk to other grown-ups too, but we will make sure that something is done.
